A CREDO EXPERIENCE

The Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (USA) is the organization which provides medical insurance, pension, and benefits for ministers and other church workers in our denomination. Its primary mission for over three hundred years has been to care for the church's employees in a way that nurtures and strengthens the church as a whole. The Board recognizes that the healthier pastors are in all aspects of their lives, the healthier and stronger Christ's Church will be as a result

One way which the Board seeks to care for pastors is through CREDO Conferences. These are conferences where PC(USA) pastors may cultivate wholeness — their spiritual, vocational, health, and financial well-being — to better serve the Church. "Each CREDO conference becomes an intentional, Christ-centered learning community, as participants share with one another their knowledge, experience, compassion, and care. In this way, CREDO helps participants replenish their spirits and rediscover the passion that first animated their call to ministry" (from the Board of Pensions website).

These experiences are by invitation only, and are designed for pastors in three different chapters in ministry: newly-ordained, mid-career, and late-career. The minister makes an investment of \$500 for the week's experience, and the Board of Pensions covers the remaining cost, including travel, lodging, food, and leadership for the week. As one participant shared on the Board's website: "This is about the rest of your life in ministry. And the potential is that what you will learn, and what you will plan from this, will positively affect not only your ministry, but also your life, your family life, everything."

I received an invitation to participate in a CREDO Conference in 2019, and after much prayer and consideration, I registered for this experience from February 26-March 4 at

Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center, in Little Rock, Arkansas. I will be taking this as one week of my professional development leave for this year, and I am grateful for this opportunity to reflect and seek further renewal. Let me share why.

The last two years have been full of much change in my life, both on a personal level and in my ministry in the church. As I marked the 20th-anniversary of my ordination in November, that was likely the midpoint of my career. Such a milestone gives me pause to reflect on where I am in this time in ministry, and what areas I need to refocus and take better care of myself, so that I can offer my best back to God, to my family, and to you, the congregation I serve. That includes examining all aspects of life and health - physical, spiritual, financial, emotional. It is not always easy to open ourselves up to such self-examinations. But I feel God calling me to experience this self-reflection at this time. I was invited to particiapte in CREDO three years ago, and did not feel that was the right time. When I received that invitation last fall, I felt that was God's way of saying, "Now is the time, Frank."

As I go to Arkansas at the end of this month for this experience, I would ask for your prayers. I would ask that you hold me and the other participants in prayer as we experience this spiritual retreat of self-reflection and examination. And I promise to share with you the lessons I learn during this week. For just as I experienced valuable learnings from my sabbatical in 2013, I anticipate experiencing new learnings from this CREDO Conference which will be long-lasting, as well.

FINANCIAL NOTES AND THANKS

END OF 2018: In November, we notified you that we were facing a significant shortfall in income for 2018 due to deaths, moves, and changes in people's financial circumstances. Your generous, faithful response is deeply humbling, to say the least. We ended the year receiving almost \$3,000 more income that what we spent for the year. Our budgeted expenses were about \$11,000 less than what we budgeted, and our total income was about \$4,000 more than what we budgeted. We are grateful for your generous support of this Open. Caring. Community!

2019 PER CAPITA: Did you know that we as a church pay to the larger church (presbytery, synod, and general assembly) a per capita mission payment that is based on our membership each year? This is part of our annual budget each year, and is a commitment we fulfill as a connectional church. For 2019, that amount per member is \$40.72, or approximately \$8,500 for the year.
