### GRATITUDE TO GOD STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY - OCT. 13

How do we express gratitude to others? The tried and true way is writing a thank you note and putting it in the mail, right? I wish I was as good at this as others. I am always so touched by words of thanks that people send to me, especially because I know the time and effort it took to sit down and write those words. Unfortunately, I seem to resort to emails and texts to send words of thanks - they express my gratitude, but not with the same personal touch!

Sometimes, when we are wrapped up in our personal lives and all the busyness that comes with it, we can forget to acknowledge our gratitude to others. We may not notice when someone covers for us when we are late to work, or takes care of a household chore, or pays us a compliment. Gratitude can get lost in our stresses and self-centeredness.

The same can be true of our faith and gratitude to God. We complain about all that's wrong in our lives, without recognizing the goodness that God has given to us. We stress about not having enough, without acknowledging how much we truly do have. Like the other nine lepers who are healed by Jesus, we often can keep walking away from the source of our new life, and fail to turn around, toward the giver of health and love, and say, "Thank you!" (Luke 17)

This month is our opportunity to reflect on what God has given to us, and how we are called to give back to God as a community of faith in our stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. When we consider what God has given to us - unconditional love and grace in Jesus Christ - then we are led to freely offer in gratitude our gifts to God. On Stewardship Sunday, October 13, we will bring to God our gifts of gratitude.
